Citizens' lists

In many municipalities between 3,000 and 5,000 inhabitants, which vote according to the proportional electoral system, there are also citizen lists, so lists that cannot be attached to a specific political party. These lists are often made up either of candidates who feel close to one party or another, but whose party has not been able to put together a complete list, or of candidates without a party.

The political orientation of the candidates can vary greatly. The electoral program of such a list can only be consulted locally, by approaching the different candidates, by consulting possible publications or by visiting a local electoral evening where the different lists and candidates present their priorities.
